The Continuing Saga of Legislative Efforts to Suppress Voting Rights in Ohio

Much attention has recently been focused on a Special Election in Ohio on August 8 to amend the Ohio State Constitution. On the ballot is the question of whether to raise the voter threshold for approving amendments to the Constitution, a change sought by the Republican-led legislature. Critics of the proposal say that it is actually designed to curb current efforts by Ohioans to protect abortion rights in their Constitution, as well as to strengthen the power of the Ohio GOP lawmakers, who currently hold super-majorities in both the House and Senate.

We encourage you to participate in the upcoming election in the following ways. If you live in Ohio, we suggest you familiarize yourselves with the issues raised and make every possible effort to vote in this off-cycle election. This will help to ensure that the outcome reflects the will of the majority of Ohio voters, not a small minority with targeted interests. If you are already registered to vote in Ohio, you may vote by mail, but must request an absentee ballot by August 1 from the Ohio Secretary of State. See instructions here.

Thanks to the efforts of ClassACT board members **George Putnam** and **Carl Muller**, Harvard was persuaded to allow half of our 50th reunion contributions to Harvard to be designated for the <u>Benazir Bhutto Fellowship Program</u>, a fellowship which supports scholars from Muslim majority countries enrolled in the Edward S. Mason Program (MC/MPA) of the Kennedy School of Government. As a result of their efforts and the generosity of 40 classmates who made direct donations, as of July 13th we raised \$857,000 toward the program. ClassACT is deeply grateful to classmates whose donations, large and small, will enable continuation of the program for several more years.



The Center for Public Service and Engaged Scholarship at Harvard is the clearinghouse for all public service efforts throughout the College. It also supports **Phillips Brooks House Association**, the largest student-run, community-based, nonprofit public service organization at Harvard College.

Associate Dean Travis Lovett has reached out to ClassACT HR73 to say:

"volunteer registration is open for Harvard's fourth annual **Global Day of Service** on Friday, September 1st – **you can sign up to volunteer here!** The Global Day of Service is open to the greater Harvard community (all students, staff, faculty, and alums). Projects include helping local schools get

ready for the upcoming school year; organizing supply drives; developing lesson plans, resource guides, and curriculum; conducting voter registration drives; organizing social media campaigns; and working on multimedia and technical projects. Site assignments will vary between **locally based projects** in the Greater Boston area and **all access projects** that will be hosted remotely for volunteers to join from around the world. All of the above access projects will have a designed campus hangout space for volunteers to connect with one another."


Class Survey Results
