What does a Board do?

Board = Governance

- ▶ The oversight body for the nonprofit
- ▶ The legal voice for the organization
- ▶ The decision epicenter for mission, strategy, and goals

1. Begin with a grand, inspirational idea

- ▶ “Making a difference” is contagious
- ▶ Talk to your friends about your idea,
But don't put them all on the Board!



2. Seek diversity on your Board

Get people that don't look like you, think like you, or possess your skill set

- ▶ Age and gender diversity
- ▶ Culture and racial diversity
- ▶ Diversity in point-of-view
- ▶ Skill set diversity
 - ▶ e.g., accounting, business, legal, education, subject expertise, fundraising

Best predictor of a great Board member

Is NOT wealth or connections

- ▶ *It is the fire in the belly*



3. Tell ‘em about the money

- ▶ Be clear about “get/give“ responsibilities for fundraising before the handshake
 - ▶ Set an explicit minimum amount for EVERYONE
- ▶ Be sure the whole team understands the Business Plan



4. Set term lengths

- ▶ Renewable, variable “term limits” will give freshness and flexibility to a healthy Board
- ▶ Develop a recruitment pathway (e.g., KCE global fellowship)
 - ▶ *RECRUITMENT should always be on your mind!*
- ▶ Start with a small Board and grow

6. Codify your processes

Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws are not enough

- ▶ Define basic roles and responsibilities in your Bylaws
 - ▶ Develop additional easily-modifiable electronic documents (e.g. *Provider Manual, Instructor Manual, Operations Manual*), so that practices are reproducible and analyzable
- ▶ Use QR codes and Google Docs (or similar free software) to store, organize and share your data
- ▶ Develop an *Onboarding Package for new Board members*, and keep it updated to clarify EXPECTATIONS
 - ▶ Assign new members a mentor to guide and excite them

7. Promote professional development

- ▶ Hold an annual retreat for all Board members
 - ▶ HAVE FUN, brainstorm, and set goals (e.g., 5 year strategic plan)
- ▶ Promote Board members' attendance at conferences to learn and network
- ▶ Provide targeted information



8. Manage adversity

- ▶ The big world is a treacherous and unpredictable place, so expect disasters
- ▶ But the most destructive forces erupt from within.....
 - ▶ Be alert to Board member conflicts of interest and perform due diligence about character and team behavior
- ▶ Make something good out of something bad!



9. Engage

- ▶ Secure Board member “Buy-in”
 - ▶ Make *ad hoc* and permanent committee assignments
 - ▶ Appoint ambassadors to major projects/geographic areas
- ▶ Assign fundraising responsibilities to everyone
- ▶ Promote hands-on involvement
 - ▶ Your most powerful magnet for Buy-in



10. Evaluate

- ▶ Evaluation is the soul of self-improvement
 - ▶ Titrate to resources, complexity of mission and Board style
- ▶ It does NOT have to be tedious and time-consuming
 - ▶ Google Forms has simplified everything!
- ▶ Evaluate goals and performance using KISS principle
 - ▶ Find objective success metrics (e.g., clients served, dollars raised)
 - ▶ Keep surveys short and simple, if you want anybody to respond
